We operate 2 of the 63 syringe exchange programs servicing Kentucky.

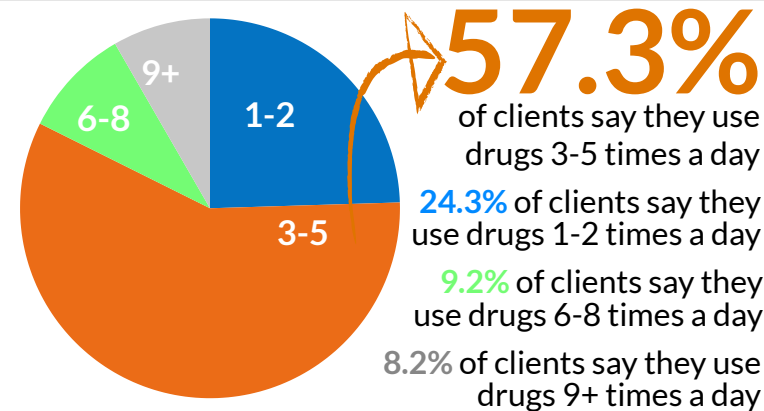

Through our program,

62,231

dirty needles have been kept off the streets from August 2016 to September 2019



2.9%

of clients have been screened for hepatitis C at an SEP visit

9.2%

of clients have been tested for HIV at an SEP visit

27.2%

of clients admit to sharing needles and other supplies at their initial visit

35.9%

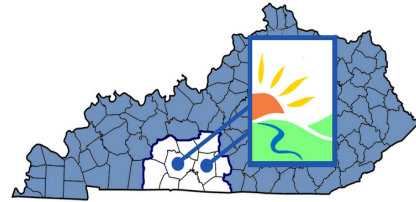
of clients said that they have overdosed when asked at their initial visit

63.6%

or clients said that they have witnessed a friend or family member overdose when asked at their initial visit

66.0%

of clients said that they have been in recovery at some point

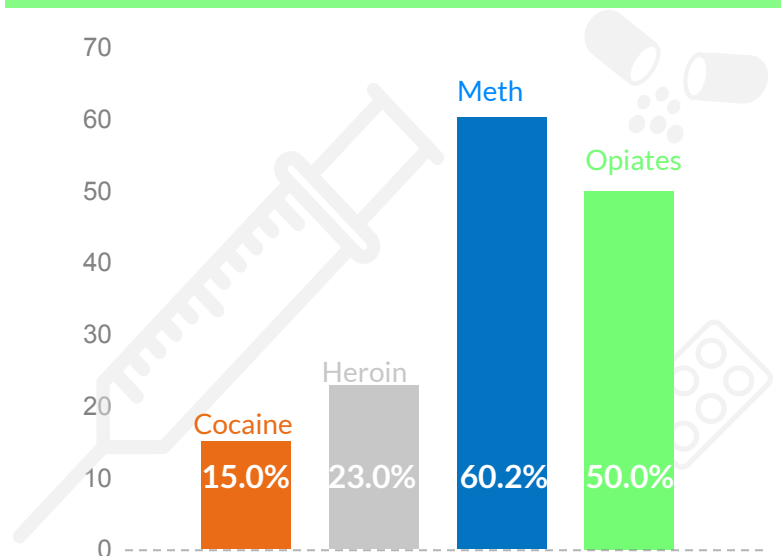
