

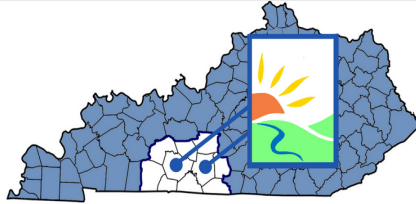

Barren County

We operate 2 of the 63 syringe exchange programs servicing Kentucky.

19.2% of our clients come from areas outside of Barren Co.

Through our program, **4,069** dirty needles have been kept off the streets from April 2018 to September 2019

The average number of needles each client has returned* for the duration of the program is

156

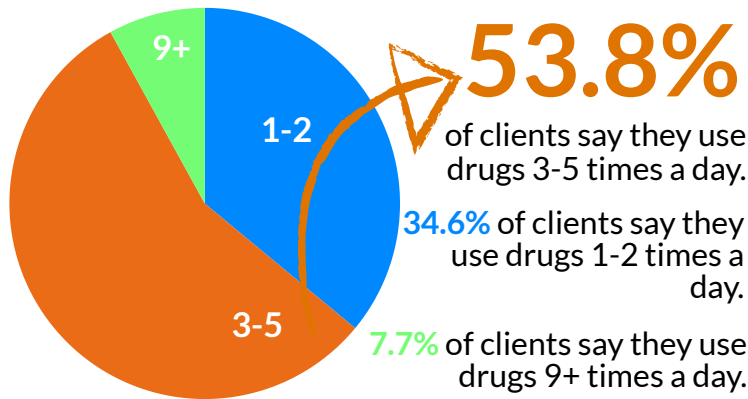

Naloxone kits have been given out to 19 individuals from April 2019 to September 2019.

88.5% of our clients say they use or have used some form of tobacco products

7.7% of clients have been tested for HIV at an SEP visit

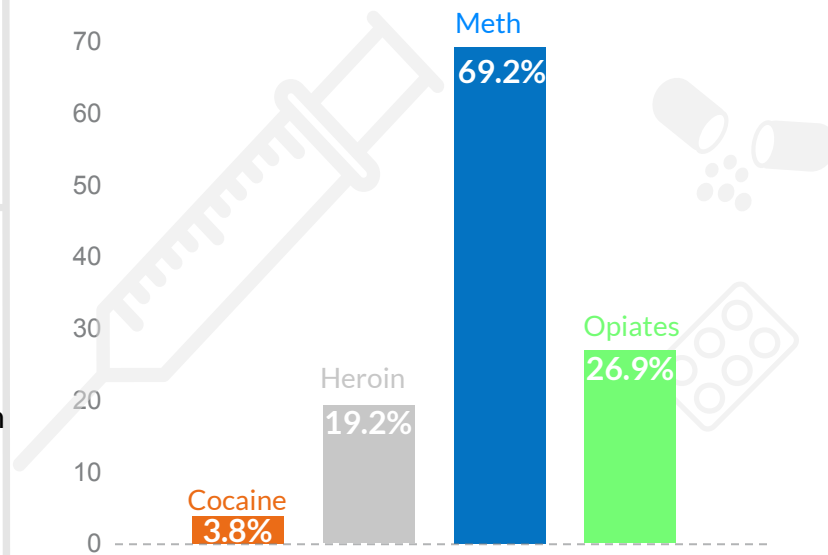
11.5% of clients have been screened for hepatitis C at an SEP visit

23.1% of clients admit to sharing needles and other supplies at their initial visit

38.5% said that they have overdosed when asked at their initial visit

61.5% said that they have witnessed a friend or family member overdose when asked at their initial visit

92.3% said that they have been in recovery at some point



69.2% of our clients say their drug of choice is methamphetamine

26.9% of our clients say their drug of choice is opiates

*NOTE: Some of the clients use more than one drug (i.e., same person can/will be counted more than once if applicable, therefore percentages will not add up to 100%)
